skills Part of this is using 'higher order thinking skills' These are the skills used to analyse and manipulate information (rather than just memorise it) In the 19 0s, Benjamin Bloom identified a set of important study and thinking skills for university students, which he called the 'thinking triangle' (Bloom, 19 6: see Figure 1)
