Thomas Clarkson Clarkson mentions plans afoot in England to organize a company to produce by free labor, manufacture and un-dersell commodities now produced entirely by slave labor This Free Labour Company was to be capitalized at the tremendous sum of four million pounds<sup>5</sup> Early in January, 1827, there was organized in Philadelphia the
